

# Safe Use of Tenders in Chichester Harbour



Chichester Harbour Conservancy recognises that persons using tenders are responsible for their own safety but are concerned that some may be taking unnecessary risks.

- T**enders can be fatal. There have been deaths in Solent Harbours and many lucky escapes.
- E**nsure you can be seen at night — carry a torch or a white lantern.
- N**ever get in a tender without a lifejacket.
- D**on't drink and drive — excessive alcohol and tenders do not mix.
- E**njoy yourself! You're in one of the best boating harbours in the world.
- R**emember it is critical not to overload your tender. Make sure you balance the weight.
- S**ea, weather and tide conditions must be suitable for your trip. If you are unsure, don't risk it.

## **Westlands Boathouse**

### **Conditions of Use**

1. All persons using the Boathouse do so at their own risk.
2. The Conservancy will not accept liability for any loss or damage to property left within the facility.
3. No fuel may be stored within the Boathouse
4. Lockers must be cleared marked with the owner reference number.
5. The Conservancy maintain the right to open and remove goods in any lockers which are not clearly marked.
6. Any property seized will be stored for a maximum of 3 months before disposal.
7. No parking is allowed on the hard or in the access road leading to the Boathouse.
8. Vehicles using the Westlands CarPark must display a current car park pass.
